PREFACE

THIS REPORT WAS FIRST PUBLISHED IN LATE 2022.

Since then, several changes have taken place in healthcare delivery.

Enthea has rapidly expanded their initiative offering what could become the first psychedelic insurer. While we're a long way from equitable access, this is at least a strong move forward.

Along similar lines, <u>Field Trip</u> responded to the massive layoffs in the tech industry this year by offering no-cost psychedelic-assisted therapy to affected employees.

<u>Psychedelic stocks have plummeted</u> for various reasons, none of which are real causes for alarm. The industry is moving ahead.

More municipalities have begun decriminalization, and Colorado and Oregon both legalized access to some psychedelic-assisted therapies.

However, we can no longer consider the psychedelics industry as monolithic. Now we witness fragmentations galore, most notably the division between individuals and organizations that drive growth in traditional ways (via legacy capitalist systems), and those that drive growth in non-traditional ways (via subordinating profit to people and principles).

We will continue updating this report throughout 2023. In the meantime, we hope you find the information contained in this directory useful.

INTRODUCTION

SKILLFULLY ADAPTING TO CHANGE

ne of the best ways to future-proof any healthcare organization or career trajectory is to recognize the inevitability of systems changes: changes in organizational structure and culture, changes in healthcare education. Systems changes will also entail changes to service delivery, from the design of clinics and institutions to digital medicine and telehealth. Psychedelic psychiatry and psychedelic therapy are catalyzing systems changes in healthcare.

In 2020, the psychedelics sector was valued at \$3.8 billion.

In 2021, the psychedelics sector was valued at \$4.29 billion...

The psychedelics sector—not even including valuable support services—is expected to



reach \$10.35 billion by 2028, a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 13.4%.

Are you prepared to integrate psychedelic-assisted therapies into your organization or clinical practice?


This guide is for healthcare administrators and wellness practitioners alike. It covers several aspects of preparation including training employees, participating in

clinical research, optimizing patient care, blending treatment modalities, working with an extended care team, and performing community outreach.

Treatment and referral protocols are changing as psychedelics are incorporated into clinical care.

This chart published on Research Gate visualizes the increasing number of psychedelics papers published in peer-reviewed journals—and the evidence base grows daily.



The <u>Biden administration</u> has announced intentions to roll out protocols for some psychedelic-assisted therapies within the next year or two at the latest. Psychedelic therapies are currently in final stages of clinical trials.

This guide will take you through some of the steps needed to navigate complex policy changes.

If you are unfamiliar with psychedelic medicine, it would be a good idea to form strategic partnerships with local clinics and nonprofits specializing in this area of treatment. Working with <u>social workers</u> and law enforcement will help you build competencies in harm reduction and form community wellness alliances.

Moving forward, it is advised to have at least one board member familiar with psychedelics on your advisory team. However, the most immanent concern is staff training.

TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION FOR LICENSED PRACTITIONERS

Licensed practitioners have access to a number of training programs. Training and certification in psychedelic-assisted therapies may be focused on one specific medicine/compound or be broader in scope.

Some programs are offered by for-profit organizations seeking therapists specializing in their proprietary medicines and modalities. Others are offered by non-profit organizations or universities.

Please note the <u>Students for Sensible Drug Policy (SSDP) Psychedelic Career Development Pipeline Project</u>, if fully funded, plans to establish a scholarship fund and low-cost, accessible training for practitioners.

With additional training you can future-proof any healthcare career by adding additional value to clients. Similarly, you can create a new niche in specialized areas such as:


- Sex and relationship therapy
- Family therapy
- Play therapy, narrative therapy, or art/music therapy
- Hypnotherapy
- Pastoral counseling
- End-of-life and grief counseling

Training now gives you a competitive advantage, but please remain committed to staying current with the research.

With few exceptions, the following list of training programs are for those who already have licensure and certification as a therapist, counselor, psychologist, or healthcare professional.

TRAINING PROGRAMS: GENERAL

<u>ATMA</u> is a Canadian company offering several courses for therapists and clinicians including Introduction to Psychedelic-Assisted Therapy, Advanced Psychedelic Training, and <u>free information sessions</u>. They also conduct <u>ongoing clinical trials</u>.



AWE's psychedelic therapy training program--AWE is a non-profit organization offering a three-year hybrid graduate program, with both Masters and PhD tracts in psychedelic therapy. What makes the AWE program unique is that half of it consists of intensive field study retreats (a total of 6 ten-day intensives).

<u>California Institute of Integral Studies (CIIS)</u> offers a certificate program in psychedelicassisted therapies and research; the program is offered hybrid or online. Coursework is developed in conjunction with MAPS.



Center for Consciousness Medicine has a multifaceted psychedelic guide training program

<u>Center for Natural Intelligence</u>—this NYC medical clinic indicates that they may soon offer training for therapists in psychedelic medicines including but not limited to ketamine

<u>Center for Optimal Living</u>--offers certificate courses and online training for therapists specializing in progressive approaches to addiction recovery and harm reduction

Changa Institute in Oregon offers psilocybin facilitator training

<u>Compass Pathways</u> offers a brief therapist training program (10+ hours over five days) for mental health professionals. It is primarily related to psilocybin and geared towards the company's ongoing clinical trials.

<u>Fluence</u> specializes in psychedelic-assisted therapy education and training. They offer several certificate programs for healthcare professionals, including courses in specific medicines like ketamine and psilocybin.

<u>Holos Foundation</u> is a non-profit organization offering programs for clinicians and therapists including one on end-of-life care. They also offer clinician training in ketamine-assisted therapy

<u>Innate Path</u> psychedelic therapy training

<u>Institute of Psychedelic Therapy</u> has a two-year hybrid training program

<u>Integrative Psychiatry Institute</u> offers a one-year psychedelic-assisted therapy training program

<u>Inward Bound</u> is a Dutch organization with a 3-month online training course for healthcare professionals; they also have psilocybin retreats

MAPS is one of the most, if not the most, established nonprofit organizations in the psychedelic space. Their public benefit corporation now offers their bespoke MDMA Therapy Training for clinicians, in alignment with their pioneering studies that have pushed MDMA from the fringes to the mainstream of mental health care. The program is blended (online and in-person) and costs \$5000 plus additional fees for lodging at in-person training sessions at multiple locations in the United States. Estimated time commitment for participants will be between six to eight hours per week. Full and partial scholarships are available through the MAPS Health Equity Fund. MAPS also offers a Manual for MDMA-Assisted Psychotherapy, which is "designed for researchers who already have training, competence and credentialing as psychotherapists."



Matter.Academy lists training programs and have a few of their own.

<u>Microdose</u> Science of Psychedelics Program is geared towards licensed practitioners, and is developed in accordance with the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME). It is a multi-faceted program, with modules on MDMA, ketamine, microdosing, addiction, and more.

<u>Michener Institute</u> Foundations of Psychedelic Psychotherapy is a 15-week certificate course for clinicians and healthcare professionals.

MIND Foundation's Augmented Psychotherapy Training (APT) is a 2-year course for physicians, clinicians, and licensed therapists


Mind Medicine Institute in Australia has a Certificate in Psychedelic-Assisted Therapies



MindSetting Institute is a Canadian company offering proprietary training

<u>Mindspace</u> is run by the Numinous company, and they offer various courses including harm reduction, ketamine, MDMA, and psilocybin

Naropa University Certificate in Psychedelic Assisted Therapies—is a 10-month postgraduate program offered in collaboration with MAPS; they also offer a shorter course in MDMA assisted psychotherapy, also in conjunction with MAPS



Center For Psychedelic Studies

<u>Numinus</u> is a Canadian company offering practitioner training as well as short courses in harm reduction and the fundamentals of psychedelic therapy; they also conduct ongoing clinical trials

<u>Phoenix Academy</u> and its associate, <u>Chiron Academy</u>, offer a 100-hour online training program as well as in-person training at retreat centers.

<u>Portland Psychotherapy</u> is a clinic and research center offering several courses and training programs

<u>Psychedelic Coalition for Health</u> has a one-week in-person training program for healthcare professionals

<u>Psychedelics Today's Education Center</u> has a number of courses for the general public but a few of them introduce clinicians to psychedelic assisted therapies

<u>Psychedelic Somatic Institute</u> offers an apprenticeship program for healthcare practitioners, which includes a required experiential component; it costs almost \$10,000.

<u>Psychedelic Support</u> offers some free courses to the general public as well as accredited continuing education courses for healthcare professionals

<u>PsyTech</u>'s Fundamentals of Psychedelic Medicine course is inexpensive and designed for the general public but has enough content useful for clinicians curious about psychedelics

<u>Sage Institute</u> has currently stopped accepting applicants to their training programs; it is worth checking back as they offer a two-year internship program as well as a ketamine-assisted therapy training program for healthcare professionals

<u>SCPTR</u> is a non-profit organization that offers an 8-week online program with modules in MDMA, ketamine, and psilocybin



SoundMind is a non-profit organization offering a Foundations of Psychedelic Therapies course. This is an 8-month certificate program, held entirely online with weekly live classes. SoundMind also operates a medical clinic in Philadelphia, where students will have access to field training focusing on ketamine. The course covers other medicines including MDMA and psilocybin, and offers additional specialty tracks for those who complete the program. Although it is described as a "graduate-level training program for clinicians and other professionals," being a clinician is not a requirement for acceptance into the SoundMind program. Tuition is \$9,500. Applications are currently closed.

Sunstone Therapies offers therapist training focusing on psilocybin

<u>Synthesis Institute</u> has a therapist training program that lasts more than a year and costs around \$10,000. They also offer several free online workshops and courses. Synthesis specializes in psilocybin.

<u>Therapsil</u> is a psilocybin company offering bespoke training for medical professionals and other licensed practitioners

<u>Vancouver Island University</u> has a graduate certificate program in psychedelic-assisted therapy

TRAINING PROGRAMS: KETAMINE

Although ketamine is not technically a psychedelic, it has been colloquially categorized as one because of its subjective psychedelic effects and its therapeutic applications in treating multiple mental health disorders.

Ketamine is legal and therefore already being used in clinical practice.

Training in ketamine now would be a good way to get started future-proofing your career or organization. You can get training as a therapist or add ketamine-assisted therapy to your clinical practice as a value-added service.

Many of the general training programs listed in the previous section include coursework in ketamine. The list below includes organizations exclusively specializing in ketamine.

MANY OF YOUR PATIENTS WILL ALREADY BE SELF-MEDICATING: WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW AND HOW TO REDUCE HARM

<u>Millions of Americans</u> use psychedelics on their own for therapeutic or recreational purposes. Many of them are afraid to talk to their healthcare providers about their choices. Some of them simply prefer to use psychedelics on their own rather than in a clinical setting.

Providing clients with resources will minimize harm and empower them with knowledge.

INSURANCE

<u>Enthea</u> has one of the only non-profit benefit plans organizations can use to offer employees access to psychedelic assisted therapies.

More psychedelic-sympathetic benefit plans are likely to emerge, and getting listed with them would be a great way to expand your business. Or perhaps you as a healthcare leader could start your own benefit plan.

PUBLIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL WORK

As trained systems thinkers, social workers recognize the complex interplay between macro level factors (sociological issues), meso level factors (family dynamics), and micro level factors (personal psychology). They also use the biopsychosocial model: taking into account a client's physical, psychological, and social wellbeing.

Social workers understand the importance of social justice, too, and therefore play a role checking and balancing capitalist trends and racism in the psychedelic industry.

Many social workers work directly with policymakers and leaders, and are in the position to spearhead local policy reform such as decriminalization. Social workers and healthcare administrators can implement best practices in harm reduction within their organizations or in broader swathes of the community.

Social workers can also serve as public health educators, changing the discourse used to discuss drugs with young people and teaching kids about responsible, safe drug use. Likewise, social workers can build on the successful harm reduction strategies used in cities like Vancouver, Oakland, and Denver to influence elected officials and leaders in law enforcement.

GUIDING THE FUTURE OF HEALTHCARE

Universities and university-partnered medical research facilities support psychedelic science, allowing you to consider multiple ways to place your healthcare organization on the leading edge.

The best way to do this is by becoming a hub for clinical trials. You could do this in conjunction with <u>universities</u> or with the private sector.

You could also make waves with public education and outreach. The psychedelics community is still small enough that you can have a voice in conferences and online events. Becoming involved in a small communities of psychedelic-assisted practitioners is one way to spearhead improved patient outcomes and improved wellbeing among healthcare workers.

Encouraging your team to upgrade their skills, you could improve your organization's standing. Teaching your staff about harm reduction, educating staff about psychedelics, and busting myths will improve patient outcomes.

Healthcare leaders can take it a step farther by becoming an advocate, championing psychedelic assisted therapy in order to improve patient outcomes. You could become a community bulwark and start your own healthcare nonprofit.

Finally, psychedelic-assisted therapies are changing patient attitudes towards healthcare service delivery and the healthcare experience. In a special issue of the journal *Pharmacopsychiatry,* Gründer (2021) states, "psychedelic therapy not only requires a new infrastructure in which it is carried out but also must be integrated into the existing system," (p. 149). Take a look at how the Experience Lab ushers in a new era of healthcare with radical changes to design.

CONCLUSIONS

- Psychedelic assisted therapy is evidence-based practice.
- Most training programs are for licensed therapists seeking skills upgrades; however, there are multidisciplinary <u>university graduate programs</u> in psychedelics.
- Alternatively you may consider becoming a psychedelic guide or trip sitter, which do not require any formal training, as long as you are careful about how you represent yourself and learn about harm reduction.
- Learning about psychedelics keeps you up to date with the latest research in neuroscience; not only is it exciting but also gives you a competitive advantage.
- As the market for your services grow, consider developing a niche such as psychedelic
 therapy for the elderly, for people with terminal illnesses, or for adolescents. Psychedelics
 can be integrated into family therapy, marriage therapy, and sex therapy practices, or
 integrated into art, music, or narrative therapy.
- To enhance your practice, you can also offer courses and workshops online, or engage in public speaking.
- In addition to your primary practice, you could become an advocate for drug policy reform and social justice.
- If you are passionate about psychedelic assisted therapy, you could consider leveraging your expertise as a board member, advisor, or policymaker.
- Therapists can be geographically independent. Psychedelic assisted therapy lends itself well to telehealth.

APPENDIX: PSYCHEDELIC CLINICS

ADMINISTRATORS:

You may consider partnering with a clinic in order to boost your own capacities for helping patients. It is worth noting that many psychedelic clinics have pipeline models integrated with biotech research and development. A <u>Wired article</u> reveals a dystopian potential here, well worth noting. On the upside is the fact that well-heeled clinics may have rigorous standards, given their high level of accountability to stakeholders and/or shareholders.

PRACTITIONERS:

You may wish to house your practice at an existing clinic or even start your own clinic.

The landscape for clinics appears saturated, but actually there is still a lot of room in the market for clinics and treatment centers that specialize in psychedelic-assisted therapies.

Options for differentiation would be serving smaller communities, hosting virtual clinics in Web3, and offering pro bono psychedelic therapies.

Complementary and alternative medicine clinics, like chiropractic offices, are already introducing psychedelic therapies into their treatment portfolios. Imagine the possibilities when you infuse psychedelics with traditional wellness services.

One good thing about investing in a clinic is that your business operates independently of the legal landscape. Similarly, you can offer a diverse range of services beyond psychedelic therapies.

To create an outstanding experience for clients consider doing something different such as:

A franchise model for standardized services and economies of scale

- Specialize in an area such as addiction treatment or end-of-life care
- Specialize in specific modalities, methods, or molecules


Another consideration is the burgeoning interest in neurotech and wearables, which neatly fit into the futurist visions of the psychedelic movement.

If, on the other hand, your interest is pure research, many clinics serve as research sites for ongoing clinical trials and therefore serve the scientific community. Right now there are many opportunities for clinics to partner with research organizations, with drug development companies, and universities.



CAVEATS

- The field is new, so standards and credentialing can be problematic and likely to change rapidly
- Most training programs are privately administered and very expensive, with few options for financial aid
- Research is still emerging so you will need to be proactive about updating skills and practices, and have the means to do so
- There are serious ethical considerations when working with psychedelics; a short online course on trauma-informed care may be insufficient when working with some clients
- Psychedelic-assisted therapies are not yet legal in most places, making it challenging to guarantee ROI
- Many training programs are run by biotech firms; you are essentially paying them to build their brand
- When you train in a program run by a biotech firm, you are being trained in their methods and medicines
